
EDITORS NOTE

OPENING & CLOSING OF THE POOL FOR 2021










Our OUTSTANDING Lifeguards!

HISTORY OF THE VINEYARDS

THANKS TO LORI MARIS FOR SHARING THE BEGINNING OF THE VINEYARDS


Around 1985-1986, is when The Vineyards started - there were 4 builders - J.L. Mason Homes, Mayer Homes, Jones, and McBride. I believe McBride is the only one that remains - if they even do. Initially, it was marketed for a retirement community for those who wanted to downsize but still have amenities like a pool and tennis courts. What was funny - while some people out here were in that group - more were young start-up families with kids - I think it surprised them.


The Vineyards was the first development like this in the St. Louis area - and it was popular.

With the savings and loan bust in the early 1990's - that slowed down things quite a bit which eventually led to the end of some of the builders - for sure - J.L. Mason. The Vineyards wasn't completely sold out, so some of the remaining lots built slightly smaller homes, and the split levels came in some with that wave until they finally finished the subdivision.


We ran across The Vineyards because it was in the Sunday paper - they had a specific insert about home building in the area - each week, it would feature ads and info about a particular subdivision. So when we were looking - and out in the area - we checked it out. The HBA - had annual awards - where they would select models that they thought were a good value for the price range - some of the homes in here were selected. Our model was the Mondavi - it won 3 years in a row. If you bought in during the HBA timeframe - you got more options for your \$ as they had special pricing deals going on, which is what we did. (Wish I'd kept one that had this subdivision in it - I can't remember the name of the insert either - but it was a regular insert in the Sunday Post for a long time).













Back in May 1998, a tornado started over around the clubhouse - I think on French Oak - didn't touchdown - but there was some shingle, window, and tree damage to homes over there. The clubhouse had a few shingles missing.

The pool up there was enlarged - a couple of lanes were added - I can't remember what year that was. It would have been the early '90s.
















THE VOLCANOES

PIG / HOG ROAST



Many people turned out and had a great time, as you can tell by the photos below.
























What a 4th of July we had at the Vineyards! I have so many pictures that I don't have enough room to show them all in the newsletter. So, I randomly pulled some out.














































GARAGE SALE
